The CWC also honored Amy Rabinowitz Kaplan with the 2012 Jane Beber Abramson Award for her dedication to pursuing justice for the wrongfully convicted.

Winston & Strawn partner [Kimball Anderson](#), who sits on the center's advisory board, was quoted in the *Chicago Daily Law Bulletin's* article, "Northwestern program to assist wrongfully convicted women," on November 30, 2012 regarding the event. "There is a population of wrongfully convicted women who have not benefited from DNA science and have been basically overlooked by the whole innocence movement in the United States," he said. "Therefore, a need exists for a project that will focus on the needs of wrongfully convicted women."
