Daimiris is experienced in international dispute resolution and focuses her practice on international arbitration, international trade, and government investigations. Her pro bono work is focused on international human rights.

She also represents clients in all aspects of government criminal and civil investigations and related litigation, including those led by federal and state enforcement and/or regulatory authorities, including the U.S. Department of Justice, regional U.S. Attorney's Offices, state and federal regulatory agencies, and state attorney general offices.
