

## FTC Holding Cross-Border Codes of Conduct Forum on Nov. 29

NOVEMBER 14, 2012

The Federal Trade Commission recently announced [the agenda](#) for its [upcoming forum](#) on cross-border codes of conduct. The forum will be an all-day series of panels held on November 29, in the FTC's office on New Jersey Avenue, in Washington, D.C. Although the forum tackles the topic of cross-border codes of conduct generally, and includes topics unrelated to privacy, one of the panels is a case study on Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation's cross-border privacy rules system. This panel will be held from 11:00 a.m. – 12:15 p.m., will be moderated by Markus Heyder (Counsel for International Consumer Protection at the FTC), and will include seven panelists from APEC as well as government and the private sector. We [wrote about](#) APEC's privacy rules system this past August.
