On May 22, 2013, Senators Frank R. Lautenberg (D-NJ) and David Vitter (R-LA) introduced S. 1009, a bi-partisan TSCA reform bill known as the <u>Chemical Safety Improvement Act</u>. If passed, the bill would increase EPA's authority to regulate existing chemicals and create additional safety screening requirements for new chemicals. The bill has bi-partisan support from eighteen co-sponsors and has been praised by both the <u>American Chemistry Council</u> and the <u>Environmental Defense Fund</u>. A parallel version of the bill has not yet been introduced in the House of Representatives.
