Joan Fife Discusses Key Strategies for Wage and Hour Motion Practice

Labor and employment partner <u>Joan Fife</u>, who is the head of Winston & Strawn's San Francisco labor and employment group, spoke at American Conference Institute's <u>10th Advanced Forum on Wage & Hour Claims and Class Actions</u> on September 14-15 in San Francisco.

- What is working?
- Pre-certification contact with class members
- How and what to raise with the court
- Motions for Summary Judgment Pre-Certification
- Strategy to file or wait?
- · What is working?
- Trying cases early as opposed to settling early: analyzing the criteria for making the call
- Motions for sanctions: when are they appropriate?
- Examples for successful strategies and tactics for both plaintiffs and defendants
- · Using dispositive motions to win the certification battle
